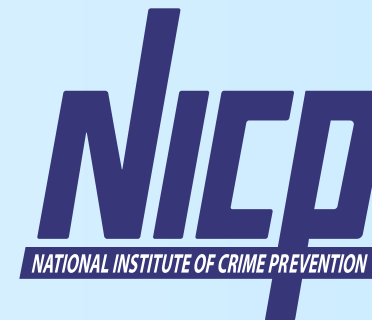

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED), is based upon the principle that "the proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear and incidence of crime, and the improvement in the quality of life."

WHO SHOULD ATTEND THIS SEMINAR?

CPTED strategies are ideal for Law Enforcement Officers, City Planners, City Managers, City Council Members, Architects, Traffic Engineers, Security Consultants, Educators or anyone involved in designing neighborhoods, schools, downtown, or buildings. It is an effective way of fighting crime and promoting business.

Cities and Counties throughout the country are adopting CPTED ordinances requiring site plan reviews with crime prevention in mind. Law enforcement officers who are specially trained in CPTED are now working closely with Planners, Architects, City Officials, and Educators to ensure the proper design of structures, schools, and neighborhoods.

Participants will learn how the design and use of the environment can control human / criminal behavior and reduce fear of crime. Participants will learn the advantages of having a CPTED Ordinance and how to construct and present it to law-makers.

Law Enforcement agencies should be involved in the preplanning of any community activity where their services will later be required.

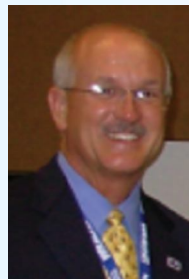
BASIC CPTED SEMINAR
